- Complete comprehension tasks and past SATs papers.
- Write a non-chronological report and a newspaper report.
- Read and respond to longer poems, some linked to the seaside.
- Consolidate grammatical terms already learnt and learn to identify the perfect and continuous/progressive forms of verbs.
- Complete past SATs questions on all areas of punctuation. Punctuate passages with missing punctuation.
- Spelling—have secure knowledge of spellings listed on Y3/4 and Y5/6 word lists.
- **Spelling test every Friday.**
- **Punctuation and Grammar homework to be completed every week and returned by Tuesday.**

Maths

- Learn to apply BODMAS to number sentences with different operations.
- All children to learn the shortcut 'formal' method of division and some children to learn the shortcut 'formal' method of multiplication.
- Become more confident with solving problems involving ratio and proportion.
- Learn how to draw and interpret pie charts.
- Practise interpreting graphs, tables and charts.
- Find percentages of numbers and amounts in a variety of contexts.
- SATs revision—past papers.

History:
